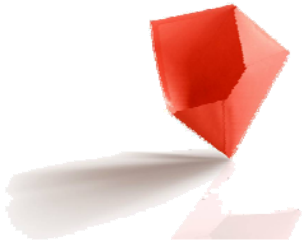
The Trust Board became open to the public from its meeting on Monday 20 April 2009. With permission of the Chairman, members of the public are able to ask questions at the Trust Board in line with the ‘Criteria for Questions’ that are set out on page 3.

## Criteria for questions

Questions from the public are invited on the following basis:

- Questions must relate to matters that are to be discussed on the Trust Board agenda, or relate to the specific business of the Trust partnership and are of a partnership nature.
- Questions addressed to individual constituent bodies of the Trust Board will not be considered.
- A member of the public may ask one question of no more than 50 words.
- Questions are to be submitted in writing to the Partnerships and Planning Team (using the contact details on the last page) within the Council's Children and Young People Services department by 10:00 am, four (4) working days before the meeting.
- Questions must be asked in person. The Chairman of the Trust Board will respond and the person can ask one supplementary question. The supplementary question must relate to the original question or to the answer given.
- If the question is being asked on behalf of another person no supplementary question is allowed.
- The Chairman may rule out repeat questions on the same subject by the same questioner.
- The Chairman retains the right to refer the question elsewhere if he/she feels it to be more appropriate.
